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

PLAINTIFF'S MOTION FOR LEAVE TO FILE  
A MOTION IN EXCESS OF TWENTY-FIVE PAGES

Pursuant to Local Rule 3.01(d), Plaintiff Commodity Futures Trading Commission ("CFTC" or "Commission") moved this Court for leave to file its Motion for an Ex Parte Statutory Restraining Order ("SRO Motion"), which exceeds the 25-page limit set by Local Rule 3.01(a). The CFTC argues that it must exceed the twenty-five page limit in its SRO Motion in

order to describe completely and accurately Defendants' ongoing fraudulent conduct and explain why this conduct warrants a statutory restraining order freezing Defendants' and Relief Defendants' assets, allowing inspection of their books and records, and appointing a temporary receiver. The Court finds that, under these circumstances, the excess pages are warranted.

For good cause shown, the CFTC's motion is **GRANTED** and the Clerk of the Court is directed to accept the overlength SRO motion for filing.
