## <u>ORDER</u>

THIS CAUSE is before the Court on the Defendant's motion to continue. (Dkt. 38) The Defendant is requesting that the sentencing, which is presently scheduled for April 6, 2020, be continued for six (6) months. Defense counsel contends that there are pending matters related to the parties' plea agreement that, once resolved, would allow the Court to render a sentence that entails all relevant information. Defense counsel advises that the Defendant is still recuperating from a major life-threatening event and a continuance would provide the Defendant the benefit of receiving necessary medical care. This is the Defendant's first motion to continue sentencing and the second motion to continue sentencing on the case. The Government does not oppose the relief sought.

Accordingly, it is **ORDERED** as follows:

- 1. The Defendant's continue is hereby **GRANTED**.
- The Sentencing in this case is rescheduled to October 5, 2020, at 9:30 AM.
  Counsel are reminded of the requirement to contact the Courtroom Deputy if this hearing is anticipated to take longer than thirty (30) minutes.
- Sentencing memoranda SHALL BE FILED IN EACH CASE and shall be filed no later than ten (10) business days prior to the date of the sentencing hearing.
